William Henry Coleman, age 76, died Saturday at his home, 532 West Troy Ave., Ferndale, after a ten week illness. The Rev. Charles E. Edenger of St. Luke's Episcopal church of Ferndale will conduct the funeral service at 2 p.m. Tuesday, in the Virgo E. Kinsey funeral home, Fifth St. at Lafayette Ave. Burial will be in Oakview Cemetery.

Born Sept. 25, 1864, in Wayne County, to the late Mr. and Mrs. Calvin (Sarah E.) Coleman, he has spent his entire life in Michigan. For the last 16 years he had been employed by the Ferndale-Pleasant Ridge board of education before retirement the first of this year. For 20 years previous he was employed as motorman for the Detroit United Railways and for five years by Ford Motor Company.

He is survived by his wife, Jessie; a son, George, at home; a daughter Mrs. Richard W. Barnett; a brother, George, of Belleville; and a sister, Mrs. Edward Freer, of Detroit.
