PERISHED IN DESERT WHILE PROSPECTING

BODY OF A YUMA MINER, WHO WAS LOST TWO YEARS AGO, FOUND IN THE DESERT

YUMA, April 18.—Practically covered with the drifting sands of the desert and the decaying remains of a small portion of his clothing, the bones of a man, weatherbeaten and bleached from long exposure to the elements, which have been identified as those of Worth Merritt, who mysteriously disappeared from San Diego almost two years ago when on a gem mining prospecting trip, were found last week at the foot of Superstition mountain, in about the center of the Imperial desert, by Bob McCain, who is a resident of Camp.

McCain, who is a cowpuncher, was herding some cattle in the vicinity of Superstition mountain, and accidentally came upon the body, for which so many fruitless searches had been made.

Merritt was a head of the mail order department of the San Diego Gem company. A year ago last June he started out to prospect in some geode deposits

QUASH SUIT FOR MILLION DOLLARS

HAD BEEN BURIED TWO THOUSAND YEARS

MESA, April 18.—Workmen moving dirt from the Hootec ruins on the J. E. Drane ranch yesterday unearthed the skeleton of a child, which was probably about six years old at the time of death. The skull was in an especially good state of preservation. The teeth were all perfect and as white as ivory. Portions of the vertebrae and of the hip bones, ribs, etc., were in good condition. The remains were taken to the office of Silverthorn & Drane and have been examined by many. Dr. Nelson and Dr. Brown decided upon the age of the child (at death), both agreeing that it was in the neighborhood of six years, with indications of its having been a female. The high cheek bones and general conformation of the skull would indicate that it belonged to one of the early races that inhabited this valley, the ruins of whose dwellings are scattered from Mesa to Casa Grande. The doctors were unable to agree upon the cause and probable time that had elapsed since death ensued, but placed the time at from 500 to 2000 years.

INVESTIGATING DEATH OF A TUCSON WOMAN

TUCSON, April 18.—Late this afternoon Deputy Sheriff Mills and Police- man Mungia arrested Cornelio Contreras, Anastacio Gayardo and Maria Gayardo. They are being held pending the completion of the investigation into the suspicious death of Mrs. Servian Martinez on Court street early this morning. They were the three persons who were last seen to leave the Martinez house.

Physicians are now holding a post-mortem over the woman's remains. At a late hour this afternoon they had not completed their work and had not arrived at the cause of death.
