(Continued From Page 1.) stant communication with the powerful wireless station here at least until next Thursday. It was stated officially, however, that they will without any orders except to proceed to their Mediterranean destinations.

Predictions as to the course the United States might propose to reestablish order and conduct an election as was done in Cuba were advanced in many quarters with some degree of authoritativeness.

PREPARED FOR EVENTUALITY. That the United States may be required to back up measures and policies is being taken into consideration by administration officials, and while there is no comment to indicate the trend of affairs there is unmistakably evidence that high officials are prepared for any eventuality.

As secretary Bryan went to conference with president Wilson, just after noon, he was asked to say definitely whether consul Canada's instructions were broad enough to include the granting of asylum to members of Gen. Diaz's staff. He replied that asylum would be accorded to anyone who sought it.
