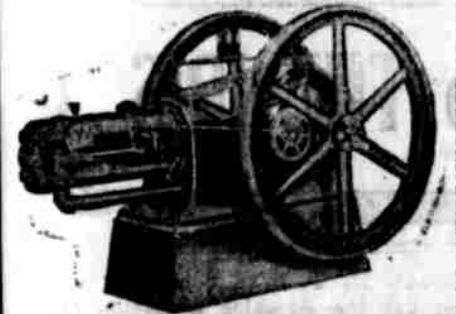

A Day's Doings in Arizona

DETAILED LOSSES IN RECENT FIRE AT BISBEE

LATEST FIGURES SHOW A COMPLETE LOSS IN LATE CATASTROPHE AMOUNTING TO ALMOST THREE-QUARTER MILLION.

BISBEE, October 17.—A careful checking up of the destruction created in the terrible conflagration of Wednesday evening shows the following list of losses, among them being the Fair store, the second largest mercantile institution in the city, and the fine Elks' building, completed but two years ago: Fair building, owned by Frankenburg Bros. & Neuman, loss including stock and new annex building used as warehouse \$300,000.

Lobby Saloon building, loss \$2,500; saloon stock and fixtures, \$5,000, including wholesale stock of liquors. Grand Hotel, loss building \$30,000; E. A. Toveca & Co., \$10,000; Club Bar, \$2,000; Ball Barber Shop, \$300; Mrs. Thomas Bennett, furniture, \$4,000.

Norton House, owned by Martin Costello, loss \$6,000; furniture \$1,000. Johnson Block, building \$35,000; furniture \$5,000; Bisbee Hardware Company \$6,000; Cosby Cash Store \$6,000. J. C. Rob, locksmith and repair shop, \$3,000.

Elks' building, loss \$35,000; furniture \$7,500; International Gas Company, \$1,000; second-hand store, (just moved in.) \$1,000. Palace Livery Stable, loss of building \$2,500; feed, etc., \$2,500.

J. B. Angus warehouse, building \$800; stock unknown. George Jariel, building \$1,000; contents unknown. Robert Hennessey, building, \$2,000; National Tea company, stock \$2,000. Hubbard building, loss \$5,000; undertaking parlors and furniture, \$3,500. J. J. Muirhead, building, \$3,500; millinery stock and house furnishings, \$1,000.

George Dunn, house destroyed by blast, \$500. On South Side: Building occupied by Uncle Sam, loss \$1,000; stock \$2,000. Francis & Kinsey, building \$1,000; stock and fixtures \$1,000. Angus block, loss on building, \$15,000; furnishings, \$2,000; Angus stock of groceries, \$20,000. Joe Lipard, barber fixtures, \$1,000. Central building, owned by Letson & Kline, \$5,000. Haden sewing machine stock, \$1,000; L. L. Gillman, jewelry stock, destroyed by blast, \$2,000. Mrs. Mary Walker, residence and furniture, \$3,000.

Baptist church, \$4,000. E. R. Miller, \$6,000. R. S. Hunt, three houses, \$4,000. Lee Maxfield, five houses, \$5,000. Also sixty other residences, by actual count, loss estimated at between \$90,000 and \$100,000, including contents not saved. Included in these sixty houses are the following: E. L. Smith of Milwaukee, occupied by J. L. McAlister; two owned by Mrs. High of Camarillo, occupied by Charles Bear and Ben Horvitz; three lodging and dwelling houses owned by Mrs. Oliver, and occupied by self; one owned by Mrs. Munch and occupied by self; one owned by Leroy and occupied by C. E. Hicks; two owned by Mrs. Lamore, one occupied by self, and one used as lodging house; one house owned and occupied by F. E. Reynolds; one owned by O. L. Silverthorn, and occupied by him; three houses owned by W. H. Brophy and occupied by Asa T. Hoy T. A. Monnier and others; one owned by J. D. Blair and occupied by J. E. Nordin; house owned by Frank Shearer, occupied by Mrs. T. H. Hall.

Partially damaged—House owned by Mrs. Richard Rundle; house owned by W. H. Brophy, occupied by Mrs. J. E. Norris; house owned and occupied by F. J. Graf. Total loss, \$729,300.

GOVERNMENT SEEKING LAND

CONDEMNATION SUITS INSTITUTED AGAINST YUMA PEOPLE FOR LAND NEEDED TO COMPLETE 3,500,000 PROJECT.

YUMA, October 16.—Suit against Yuma property owners for the condemnation of land along the Colorado river has been instituted in the United States court by the government. The land which the government is seeking to have condemned is in connection with the Laguna dam project on which the government is expending \$3,500,000.

The suit is styled 'The United States of America vs. William Burgess, George Mize, Frank, Emma and Charles Bosing and Ira F. Webster.'

In the petition which was prepared by United States Attorney Alexander it is stated that the land is needed for Laguna dam purposes. The suit is the first civil action filed in the United States court here in four years. It will be heard during the coming court term.
